



2018 Annual Accessibility Status Report

This Accessibility Status Report is the annual update on the progress of the measures taken to improve accessibility and implement the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 (AODA) and the Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation (Ontario Regulation 191/11).

This Status Report includes the accessibility initiatives that were completed to implement the strategies outlined in the City of Clarence-Rockland's Multi-Year Accessibility Plan.

The purpose of this Status Report is to make the public aware of the City of Clarence-Rockland's progress with regards to the 2018-2022 Multi-Year Accessibility Plan.

- The Accessible Customer Services Policy was reviewed;
- The Compliance of the Public Transportation Services was reviewed;
- The Accessibility Advisory Committee members organized Accessibility Awareness Activities that were held onsite during the Ottawa River Festival;
- The Clarence Creek Community Hall public washrooms were completely renovated to improve accessibility;
- Accessibility to the Jules-Saumure Park was improved with the construction of an accessible path;
- Accessibility to the Alphonse Carrière Park was improved with the construction of an accessible path;
- Accessibility to the Bourget Splash Pad was improved with the construction of an accessible path;
- An accessible shelter was constructed at the Bourget Park;
- An accessible gazebo was constructed at the St-Pascal Park.
